Coach Carr served as Head Coach of the Wolverines from 1995-2007. During his tenure, Michigan won a national championship in 1997, won or shared five Big Ten conference titles, and appeared in 13 consecutive bowl games. He amassed a record of 122-40 during his career as in Ann Arbor. He was named National Coach of the Year in 1997, and was named Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year in his last year (2007).

With Carr as coach, Michigan was ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 during all but nine of his games. Michigan finished the season nationally ranked each year but one (2005) during the Carr era. He became the first Michigan coach to win four consecutive bowl games, with 1998 Rose, 1999 Citrus, 2000 Orange, and 2001 Citrus Bowl wins.

Prior to his career at the University of Michigan, Carr coached at Eastern Michigan University and at the University of Illinois.

In 1997, Carr was inducted into both the Michigan Catholic League and Northern Michigan University Halls of Fame.

Carr ranks third all-time among coaches at the University of Michigan, with a 75% winning percentage. Carr's stands only behind Bo Schembechler and Fielding Yost in that category.
